Racism in football			
The issue of <i>racism</i> in football has not gone away, despite the UK being a multicultural society. In 2011, two top Premier League footballers were alleged to have used racist abuse against opponents during matches and were investigated by football authorities. Perhaps a sign that the problem is not being treated seriously enough by global football authorities is that the head of global football said that <i>racism</i> on the pitch could be dealt with by a shake of the hand at the end of the game. He has since apologised for his remarks. Also, the Bulgarian Football Union was fined €40 000 for the racist chanting of some fans when Bulgaria played England in a European tournament qualifying match.

The man brought a case of libel against the newspapers and won his case at the High Court in London.
