SECTION A

Answer **one** question from this Section.

Each question carries 25 marks.

- 1** (a) Identify and describe the various types of humus that can exist in a soil. (5 marks)
- (b) With reference to **either** a brown earth **or** a podsol:
- (i) using only a labelled diagram show the main characteristics of the soil profile; (5 marks)
- (ii) explain how these characteristics have developed in the soil profile. (7 marks)
- (c) Using examples from any soils in the British Isles you have studied, explain how soils can be changed by human activity. (8 marks)

- 2** Answer the following by referring to **one** of the following hazards:

Either Tropical storms;

Or Volcanoes

- (a) Describe the global distribution of the hazard. (5 marks)
- (b) Using only a labelled diagram show the main characteristics of **either** a tropical storm **or** a volcano. (5 marks)
- (c) With reference to examples, describe the effects of the hazard on the physical and human environments. (7 marks)
- (d) Discuss the ways in which people and organisations manage the hazard and its effects. (8 marks)

SECTION B

Answer **one** question from this Section.

Each question carries 25 marks.

- 3 *“Over the past 30 years, many of the nations of the world, such as those in the European Union, have grouped together, and yet, over the same period, separatist pressures have often been present.”*

Discuss this statement.

Your answer should include:

- a description of the growth of groupings of nations;
- the reasons for such groupings;
- a discussion of the reasons for separatist pressures.

(25 marks)

- 4 *“Climatic change has been a feature in the British Isles since the Pleistocene Ice Age, and recent global warming is a continuation of this change.”*

Discuss this statement.

Your answer should include:

- a description of the fluctuations in temperature and precipitation in the British Isles since the Pleistocene Ice Age;
- the evidence for fluctuations in temperature and precipitation;
- a discussion of the reasons for recent global warming and of its effects.
