Give examples to support your answer.

Section B

Representations

Either (a) Is it inevitable that a social group that is represented as alternative, eventually becomes mainstream?

Discuss with examples.

Or (b) How does the media represent a place that you have studied?

Illustrate your answer with examples.

Section C

Genre

Either (a) Do media producers rely too heavily on tried and tested genres?

Discuss with specific examples.

Or (b) Outline recent significant developments in **one** genre of your choice.

Illustrate your answer with examples.

Section D Media Audiences

Either (a) Is there still an audience for "reality TV"?

Discuss, illustrating your answer with examples.

Or (b) The problem with media audience theories is that they ignore the rôle of pleasure. How far do you agree?

Illustrate with examples from your own media consumption.
