Theme 5:	Persons	
0 9	Explain and illustrate <b>one</b> reason for thinking of ourselves as <i>surviving</i> through rather than being <i>identical</i> through time.	n time (15 marks)
1 0	Assess whether any characteristics are necessary or sufficient for personhood	i. (30 marks)
