Answer two questions.

- 1 (a) Explain the ways in which the passages you have studied about the event of the Exodus show human destiny as being in the hands of God. (20 marks)
 - (b) The passages you have studied from Isaiah reflect the view of human destiny found at the time of the Exile.
 - (i) Summarise this view of human destiny.
 - (ii) Assess the claim that the traditions of the Exodus and of the Exile show God as being more concerned with the destiny of the nation than with the destiny of the individual. (30 marks)
- 2 (a) Examine the ideas on the relationship between God and humanity which are found in the passages you have studied from the Wisdom literature. (20 marks)
 - (b) Outline the ways in which the Law defined the terms of humanity's relationship with God, and assess the claim that the relationship between God and humanity is totally dependent on Law. (30 marks)
- **3** (a) Examine the characteristics of apocalyptic writing. (20 marks)
 - (b) Outline the reasons why apocalyptic writing is described as being a response to persecution, and assess the claim that apocalyptic writing has no meaning in the 21st century. (30 marks)
