- 6 (b) (i) What examples are there of Euclio's meanness in The Pot of Gold? (8 marks)
- 6 **(b) (ii)** Megadorus is the most generous character in *The Pot of Gold*. Explain how this is important to the plot and humour of the play. (8 marks)
- **6 (b) (iii)** 'Euclio is too mean a character to be liked.' Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer. (10 marks)

- **9 (a) (iii)** 'The armour and weapons of Mycenaean society were very effective in battle.' Do you agree with this statement? Give your reasons. (10 marks)

- **9 (b) (i)** Which minerals, metals and materials did the Mycenaeans use and in what ways? (8 marks)
- 9 (b) (ii) Explain how frescoes were made. You may refer to the materials and colours used.
 (8 marks)
- **9 (b) (iii)** What do you think the arts and crafts of the Mycenaeans show us about their society? Refer to the archaeological evidence. (10 marks)
