Introduction

In studying this component of British history in the twentieth century, it will be necessary to cover other relevant aspects of the subject content in order to provide a broader historical context for students before they engage upon their research.

The **key questions** that should be considered are:

- How far did the way of life of the people of Britain change as a result of the two World Wars?
- To what extent and why did the experience of the British people at war in the First World War differ from their experience in the Second World War?

The **subject content** that should be considered in relation to the First World War and the Second World War is:

- Attitudes to war: censorship and propaganda
- Civilian life: rationing and the effects of submarine warfare; the impact of war on children and the young including Evacuation in the Second World War; the changing role of women
- Military organisation: recruitment, conscription; the dangers of attack and invasion; the Home Guard in the Second World War; air raids in the First World War; the Blitz and air raids precautions in the Second World War; the changing role of women

Completion of this controlled assessment task must reflect the specified levels of control in current Ofqual regulations for controlled assessment.

How far do **Sources E** to **K** support this interpretation?

Explain your answer using the sources as well as **your knowledge**.
