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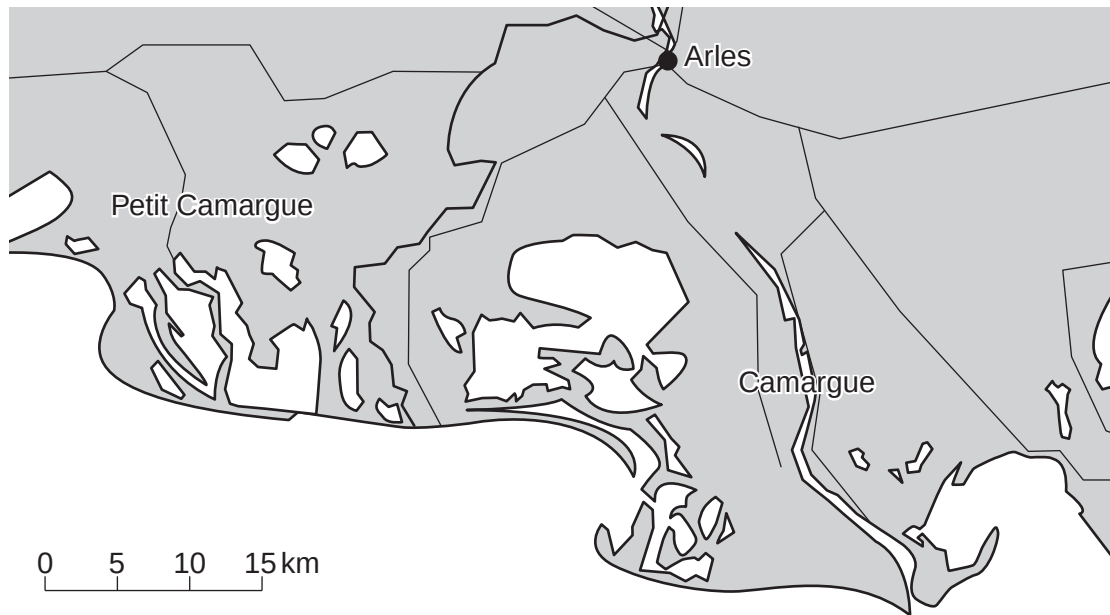
The Kariba Dam supplies 1266 MW of electricity to parts of both Zambia (including the Copperbelt) and Zimbabwe.

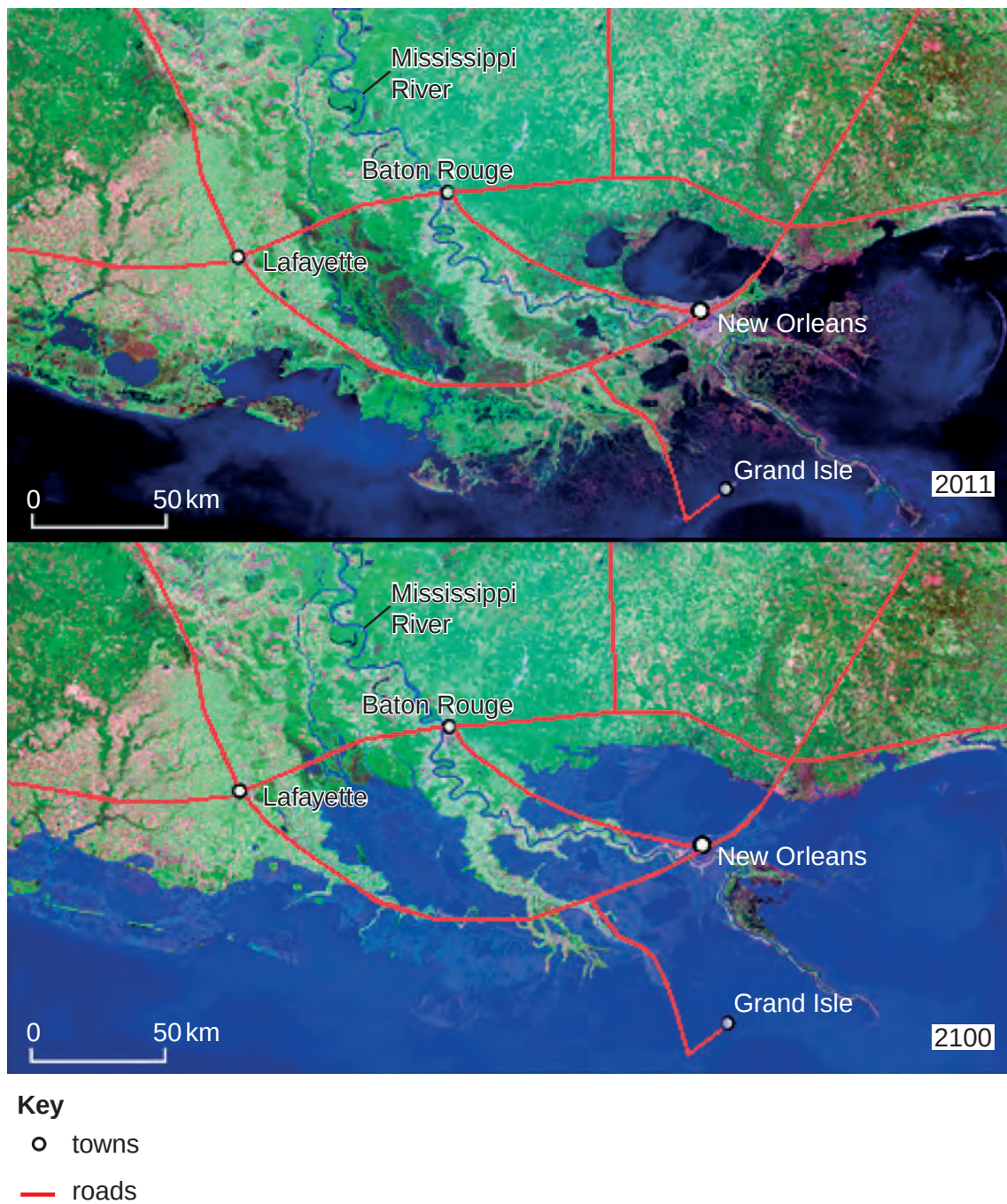


Fig. 4.1

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
