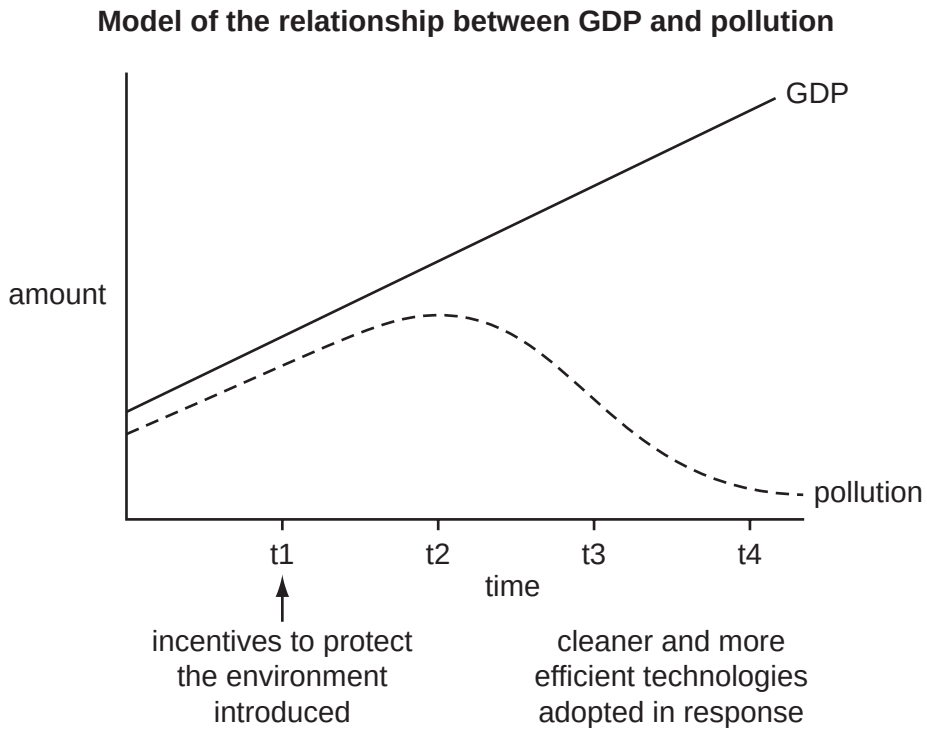

Top 10 countries in Africa receiving development aid, 2006–8

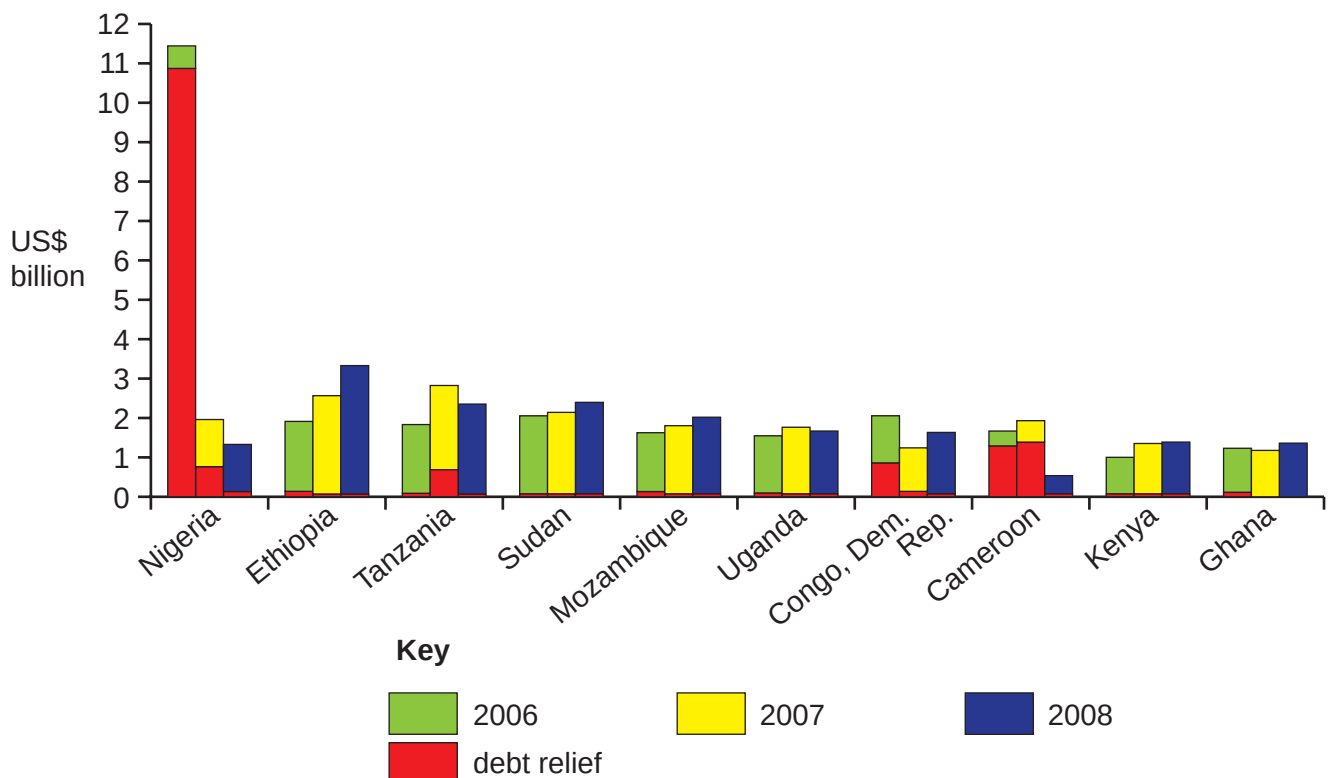
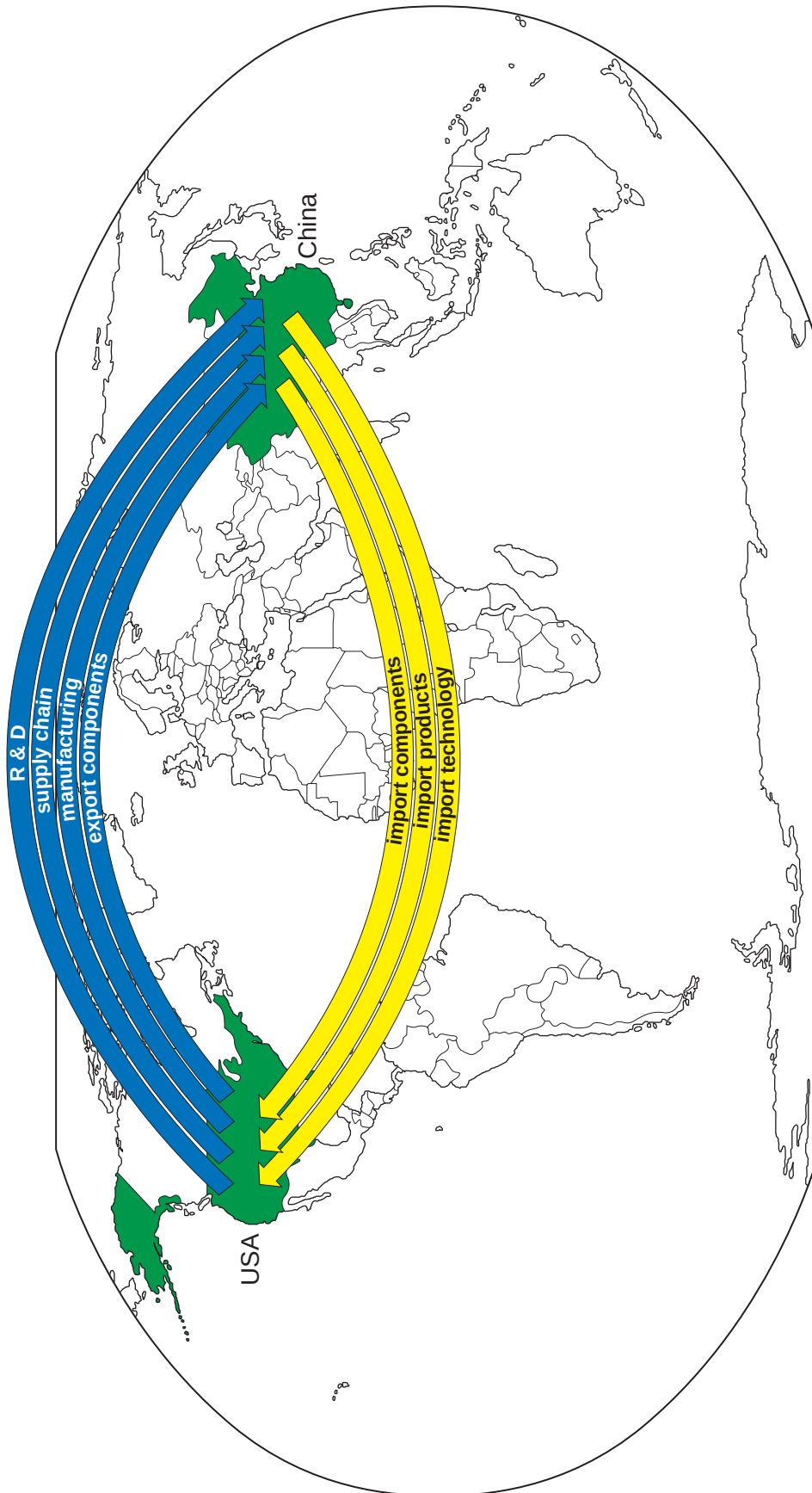
