- 4 Assess the advantages and limitations of using official statistics in sociological research. [25]

Section C: Social Differentiation and Stratification

- 5 Assess the view that women have achieved equality with men in modern industrial societies. [25]
- 6 Assess sociological explanations for the existence of racial discrimination in modern societies. [25]
