
Aim: to create an illustration for the cover of a novel

Final Evaluation:

In the beginning, I researched for Jan Vermeer's "Girl WithThe Pearl Earring" because to me the painting conveys secrecy. I loved especially the expression on the girl's face as if she knows so much more than then we do. I also looked at other book covers such as "One Hundred Years of Solitude". The cover was simple, but nonetheless effective. It had only a few main colors such as dark brown, beige, and a little bit of black. Simplicity, richness and mystery fills both "Girl in the Pearl earring" and the cover of "One Hundred Years of Solitude" and I also wanted to convey that in my experiments...

I think the successful part of my final piece is the front cover, as it is simple, and had the "secrecy" that I was looking for. I like the effect of the watercolor - soft and almost pastel. I am not sure about the newspaper text as the background because it makes the whole piece seemed too crowded. But I really like the effect of somehow using text to give the idea of many written secrets and mystery that it gives. If I had more time, I would probably do more experimentations on the other images that had more potential as a book cover, and also try to use stencil, lino prints and/grottage.








































Joana Vasconcelos

Joana Vasconcelos is a Paris born artist who now lives and works in Lisbon, Portugal. She has exhibited her works around the world in a number of group shows and many solo shows. She primarily creates sculpture and installation pieces. Many of her key works apply white crochet patterns to a variety of objects like computers, sculptures, pianos and even bridges. The works are completely covered in the crochet, with only the form and negative space to identify the object.

I chose her as another one of my artists because I like the way she's used crochet as a part of texture and pattern. It also has a link to my coursework with the crab claws.





Jan Jacque

She received a BFA from Rochester Institute of Technology, School for American Craftsmen in 1977. Her 31 year career as a full-time potter has been devoted to making beautiful objects for individuals and galleries who appreciate fine craft. She has received many awards for her creations. Four of her pieces are in the permanent collection at the Mint Museum of Craft and Design (Allen Chasanoff Ceramic Collection).

All of Jacque's pieces are handbuilt from finetextured white clay. Using both slab and coil building methods of construction, she slowly adapts the clay. In the final stages of both methods, she paddles, scrapes, and sands the pieces until very smooth; they are then airbrushed with colorants and pit fired. A long, complex process, but the results are well worth the effort. I like her work because its abstract and original, and has lots of different ways of looking at each piece. I like how she uses airbrush to make unusual effects on her pieces, (for example: Queen Trigger Fish)

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I made the shape out of newspaper first and taped it together. I then colled out two slabs, I placed one slab on either side of the shape that I made and joined them tagether to make this shape.

Evaluation

I liked the shape and movement this piece gave me. It was a shape taken from the bottom of my large crab class in S.D. I then glazed it with a granite stone glaze to give it a natural colour with some texture.









I rolled out a slab and out around my template trive and joined them tagether. As I joined them, I added same paper in the body varily to give it more of a counted orab class look. When it got leather hard, I out a clit in the back to remove the paper before firing.



Esaluation

I was pleased with my result but I felt it didn't give the full 3D counded effect I was looking for in the each clam. I used a granite ctone glage to give it a natural and textural look to my piece.

My Ceramist Fiece I re-did my piece using slabs again and joining them together. I started the base much smaller so it wasn't as wide as my first attempt. I think this time I've captured the shape but also made it my
















Process

I rolled out a slab and cut around my template three times. I joined two of them together and filled the body cavity with paper as I did with my other piece. I then added my other slab and repeated the same process. Then I created two coils to make the pincers that will then be joined to my piece. To finish off, I incided lines to suggest the form of the crab claw.

Esaluation

I think this piece captured more of a 8-D rounded effect and it was also much bigger, with more detail in the piece compared to the previous piece. I used a granite stone glaze to add the natural colour and textural feel.












Art evaluation


Throughout the course we looked at different artists to gather ideas for our final, we then took our own photos or looked on the internet and in books. I choose the topic "Bridges" and at first I looked mainly at the painter André Derain because I liked the way his painting were unrealistic and that he used bright primary colours in his paintings but then I moved on to more realistic bridge painters, because when I tried out the other style I decided it didn't really suit me well. We tried out different styles and types of media; firstly we sketched small ideas and then went on to painting and using pastels, I decided to use pastels in my final. At first I was looking at bridges in the day but then decided I wanted to do my final at night, the picture seemed more enticing. So instead of brighter colours like red and yellow I have chosen colours that give a more relaxed feel like blue and purple.
