Section B

- (a) He was in the kingdom (1) of Prusias (1). Allow 'in Bithynia'. [2]
- (b) (i) They sent (1) envoys (1) to the king (1); to ask him (1) to hand over Hannibal (1) to them (1). [6]
- (ii) statim (1), immediately (1) [2]
- (c) (They believed that) while Hannibal lived (1) they would never (1) be (1) safe (1). [4]
- (d) To take Hannibal (1) themselves (1) (if they could); he did not wish (1) to act against the laws of hospitality (1). [4]
- (e) It had been given (to him) (1) by the king (1); it had exits (1) in all parts (1). [4]
- (f) Many (1) armed men (1) were appearing (1); he was looking out from a door (1). [4]
- (g) To go round (1) all the doors (1); quickly (1) to report (1) (to him) whether he was surrounded (1) on all sides (1). [6]
- (h) (i) All the exits (1) were occupied (1). [2]
- (ii) They were after him/he was being sought (1); he could no longer (1) hold on to (1) his life (1) (allow anything that gets the sense like 'he had to die'). [4]
- (i) He took poison (1); he always (1) had it (1) with him (1). [4]

- (j) e.g. audible, petition, revive, accelerate, intelligence. (any **four**). [4]
