Paper 1 (Luke and Acts (1-21:15) Short-Answer Questions),
maximum raw mark 40

SECTION A

The Gospel of Luke

- 1 (a) 2:4 Bethlehem
- (b) 2:4-5 (Joseph belonged to) the house of David/home town
- 2 (a) 5:27 Levi (allow Matthew)
- (b) 5:30 Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors/sinners? (or similar)
- 3 (a) 8:26-27 A demoniac/possessed man.
- (b) 8:30 Legion/Mob
- 4 (a) 9:29 Transfigured/transformed/appearance changed/appearances (clothes gleamed white)
- (b) 9:35 This is my son (my chosen son), listen to him (or similar). Both ideas required in some form or other to secure the mark.
- 5 (a) 23:44 Darkness/veil of temple torn in two/eclipse
- (b) 23:46 Father, into your hands I commit my spirit (or similar)

Acts of the Apostles

- 6 (a)&(b) 1:9–11 Went up into the clouds/disappeared from sight/(two)men/angels dressed in white /some of dialogue/disciples watched (any two)
- 7 (a) 8:26-27 (Ethiopian) eunuch/official (of Candace) of Ethiopia
- (b) 8:28 Isaiah
- 8 (a) 9:17 Ananias
- (b) 9:18 Something like scales fell from his eyes (regained sight)

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- 9 (a) 12:25 John/Mark
- (b) 13:4,13 Left/abandoned them
15:36-39

- 10 (a) 18:3 Tentmaker
- (b) 18:2-3 Aquila

SECTION B

- 11 (a) 9:19 John the Baptist, Elijah, one of prophets (of old). NB. Maximum of two marks, even if all three answers given.
- (b) 9:20 You are the Christ (of God) – allow Messiah.
- (c) 9:22 Son of Man must suffer many things/be rejected by elders (or chief priests)/be killed/raised on the third day (any two – maximum 2 marks).
- 12 (a) 22:47-48 Judas kissed Jesus/it was the signal to betray him
- (b) 22:49 Said “shall we strike with the sword?”/tried to defend him/cut off the ear (of the high priest’s slave) (any two, maximum 2 marks).
- (c) 22:51 Told them to stop/healed the servant.
- 13 (a) Ch 10 Who: Cornelius (and his household)/uncircumcised Gentiles. 1 mark
What: spoke in tongues (as disciples had done at Pentecost). 1 mark.
- (b) 11:2 Jerusalem
- (c) 11:18 Gloried and praised God/recognised that salvation was also for the gentiles.
- 14 (a) 17:10 Went to the synagogue.
- (b) 17:11-12 More noble-minded (than those in Thessalonica)/received word with eagerness/ examined Scriptures daily to see if what Paul said was true/believed (any three – maximum 3 marks).
- (c) 17:13 Came down and stirred up the crowds
