The Life and Teaching of Jesus as Portrayed in Luke's Gospel

- 1 (a) Give an account of the angel Gabriel's visit to Mary, to tell her of the forthcoming birth of Jesus. [7]
(b) What do we learn from this account about
(i) Mary, and
(ii) Jesus? [5]
- 2 (a) Give an account of **one** nature miracle and **one** occasion recorded by Luke where Jesus raised someone from the dead. [7]
(b) How did different groups react to the various miracles that Jesus performed? [5]
- 3 (a) Relate the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. [7]
(b) What was Jesus teaching in this parable? [5]
- 4 (a) Describe how Jesus prepared for and carried out his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. [7]
(b) What does this event teach us about Jesus and his mission? [5]
- 5 (a) Relate what happened, according to Luke, after Jesus was taken to the place which is called The Skull up to the moment of his death. [7]
(b) Explain the significance of these events for Christians today. [5]

SECTION B**The Birth of the Church as Portrayed in the Acts of the Apostles Chapters 1 to 21:15**

- 6 (a) Describe the healing of the cripple at the Beautiful Gate in Jerusalem. [7]
(b) What do we learn about the work of the Apostles from the life of Peter as recorded in Acts? [5]
- 7 (a) Give an account of what happened when Stephen finished his speech, and the reasons why the Sanhedrin convicted him. [7]
(b) What were the consequences arising from Stephen's speech and death? [5]
- 8 (a) Relate what happened when Barnabas and Paul visited Lystra on their missionary journey. [7]
(b) The name "Barnabas" means "son of encouragement". Explain how the events recorded in Acts about Barnabas show him to be an encourager. [5]
- 9 (a) Give an account of how the jailor at Philippi came to believe in God. [7]
(b) What do the events at Philippi teach us about the way Paul conducted his missionary work? [5]
- 10 (a) According to the Acts of the Apostles, what were the roles of elders and deacons? [7]
(b) What do we learn from Acts about Paul's power and authority as an apostle? [5]

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
