Level 4	10–12 marks	<ul> <li>Makes a reasonably developed relevant response.</li> <li>shows understanding of the text and some of its deeper implications</li> <li>explores the way the writer uses language (using suitable features of expression in an empathic task)</li> <li>shows some thoroughness in the use of supporting evidence from the text</li> <li>addresses the focus of the question.</li> </ul>
Level 3	7–9 marks	<ul> <li>Makes a relevant response.</li> <li>shows some understanding of meaning</li> <li>makes some reference to the way the writer uses language (beginning to assume a voice in an empathic task)</li> <li>uses some supporting textual detail</li> <li>partly addresses the focus of the question.</li> </ul>
Level 2	4–6 marks	<ul> <li>Attempts to communicate a basic response to the task.</li> <li>makes some relevant comments</li> <li>shows a basic understanding of surface meaning of the text (of character in an empathic task)</li> <li>makes a little supporting reference to the text</li> <li>makes some attempt to address the question.</li> </ul>
Level 1	1–3 marks	<ul> <li>Limited attempt to respond.</li> <li>makes a few straightforward comments</li> <li>shows a few signs of understanding the surface meaning of the text (of character in an empathic task)</li> <li>makes a little reference to the text</li> <li>little relevance to the question.</li> </ul>
Level 0	0 marks	No rewardable response.

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
