Prvi tramvaj

Prvi tramvaj u Sarajevu je počeo saobraćati u zimu 1884. godine. Od prve do zadnje stanice trebalo je pola sata. Tramvaj je bio drveni vagon na šinama kojeg je vukao konj. Imao je 30 sjedišta a karte su se mogle kupiti kod konduktera koji je imao posebnu uniformu. Karte su bile komad papira ispisan na njemačkom, turskom i bosanskom jeziku. Kada bi prodao sve karte kondukter bi stavio lanac na ulaz i tramvaj je mogao krenuti.

Prve šine su postavljene u ljeto 1884. godine, i išle su kroz centar grada, glavnom ulicom u kojoj je bilo i najviše trgovina. Sarajevo je bilo jedini grad na Balkanu i u srednjoj Evropi u kojem je saobraćao tramvaj.

Bila je samo jedna traka po kojoj je tramvaj vozio. Konji su se mijenjali svaka tri sata. Prva bi vožnja bila rano ujutro da bi putnici stigli na prvi voz koji je iz Sarajeva išao u šest sati ujutro.

Iz tog vremena o postojanju tramvaja govore dokumenti, knjige a i slike. Poznate su i neke umjetničke slike na kojima je nacrtan tramvaj a čak je o tramvaju komponovana i jedna brza polka.
