L-Ghana Malti

Kull pajjiż għandu l-mużika tradizzjonali tiegħu. L-għana hija mużika tradizzjonali ta' Malta. Però, fil-waqt li pajjiżi oħra huma kburin bil-mużika folkloristika tagħhom, l-għana minn dejjem ma kienx irrispettat. Kien ikkunsidrat bħala mużika ta' nies mhux edukati, tal-bdiewa u tan-nisa tar-raħal.

L-għana jiffirma parti mill-identità Maltija li tnisslet mill-pajjiżi differenti li hakmu lil Malta, speċjalment l-Gharab. Jista' jkun li l-għana ma kienx irrispettat għax ċerti Maltin ma ridux jidentifikaw ruħhom mal-passat storiku tagħhom.

Il-kitarra hija l-iktar strument użat fl-għana, għalkemm qabel kienu jintużaw strumenti oħra fosthom iż-żaqq, it-tambur u l-konċertina. Kienu jeżistu hafna tipi ta' għana differenti u kollha għandhom karatteristiċi partikolari tagħhom. Għalkemm uħud minn dawn it-tipi ntesew, l-għana spontanju huwa l-aktar li baqa' popolari, fejn l-għannejja ma jkunux jafu t-tema minn qabel il-pika. Fl-għana spontanju, l-għannej iqabbel versi kontra għannej ieħor u juża ritmu ripetittiv.

L-għana kien u għadu iżjed popolari lejn l-inhawi taż-Żejtun. John Micallef, jew *Baby John*, biex ma nfixkluhx ma' missieru, huwa għannej miż-Żejtun, u hu magħruf bħala wiehed li ġej minn familja famuża għall-għana spirtu pront. Huwa wiret l-abbiltà li jqabbel versi argumentattivi u nebbiexa, li mhux biss iwaqqgħu dak li jkun qed jgħid l-għannej l-ieħor, imma wkoll li jdaħħqu lil kull min jismagħhom. Il-ġenituri tiegħu dejjem hajruh biex jimxi fit-triq tal-mużika, u kienu joħduh f'ħafna kompetizzjonijiet madwar Malta. Kienu għal żmien twil ukoll iħallsulu l-lezzjonijiet tal-kitarra.

Hafna mis-semmiegħa tiegħu jaħsbu li kieku jkanta mużika pop, jaqla' iżjed flus milli jaqla' mill-għana. Izda għal *Baby John* din hija mħabba speċjali li ma jhalliha qatt.

Parti minn taħdita ta' Charles Micallef, Mużikoloġista

Meta kont żgħir, missieri kien johodni biex nisma' l-kitarra u l-ghana. Forsi kien jaf li għalkemm kont għadni żgħir, il-hoss uniku tal-kitarra Maltija kien ser jinkiteb f'mohħi u jibqa' jinstema' matul hajti. Dak iż-żmien f'Malta hafna għannejja bdew jifthu triqat godda fil-qasam tal-mużika popolari permezz ta' kanzunetti umoristiċi. Ftit ftit, l-ghana sar aċċetat minn hafna nies u beda jinstema' anke fuq ir-radju. Bdew isiru wkoll festivals tal-ghana fejn nies ta' kull livell soċjali bdew jattendu.

Meta ġejt l-Awstralja, hallejt warajja x-xena mużikali folkloristika Maltija. F'dak iż-żmien l-Awstralja kienet differenti hafna mil-lum. Ma kienx hemm apprezzament ta' kulturi differenti, u l-mużika popolari ġennitni u malajr insejt l-ghana Malti. Ukoll, f'dak iż-żmien f'dan il-pajjiż, l-ghana kien qisu qiegħed *underground*. Kien isir biss fi djar privati jew f'xi laqgħa żgħira ta' Maltin, u rari kont tisma' dan it-tip ta' mużika.

Issa l-atmosfera hija differenti hafna, u mużika etnika u folkloristika hija aċċettata u nkuraġġuta. Izda hafna mill-għannejja fl-Awstralja huma xjuħ u hemm bżonn urġenti li niddokumentaw l-ghana fl-Awstralja, qabel ma jkun tard wisq. U wkoll ikun ta' siwi jekk iż-żgħażaġħ ta' dixxendenza Maltija jkollhom l-opportunità li jiehdu interess fl-ghana, ghax dan huwa parti mill-identità Maltija tagħhom, u ma nħalluhx jintilef għal dejjem.

Studenti Awstraljani ta' dixxendenza Maltija huma mistiedna biex japplikaw għal borża ta' studju li qieghed joffri l-Ministru tal-Kultura u t-Turiżmu. L-applikant irid ikun spicċa l-aħħar sena tal-iskola sekondarja, irid ikun laħaq id-disa' grad tal-mużika u jrid ikun interessat f'karrera tal-mużika klassika. Din il-borża ta' studju hija għal tnaħ-il xahar, u matul dan iż-żmien il-kandidat irid juri abbiltà li jistudja hafna u jkun ippreparat li joqgħod f'Malta tul dan iż-żmien.
