Question 1

However, in more recent times, the absence of such a threat has meant that conflicts have been more difficult to resolve. Question 3

International conflicts, whether Cold War or post-Cold War, have tended to be caused by much the same factors.

Discuss with reference to at least **one** Cold War conflict and at least **one** post-Cold War conflict.
