GENERAL COMMENTS

Section 1 – Listening and responding

Part A – Answer in English

Students' general comprehension in this section was good, but students must read and follow the instructions more carefully and convey their answers more precisely.

Text 1

Questions on Text 1 were answered well by most students.

Question 1a.

Young people are interested in the Internet, music and sport.

Question 1b.

The topics the young people raised with politicians included (two of):

- the education system
- the dangers of the Internet
- integration of migrants
- the protection of the environment.

Question 1c.

Young people formed a group to make suggestions and take them to the Minister of Education.

Text 2

Most students gave correct answers to the questions on Text 2. Students who identified the specific information required and conveyed it precisely scored more highly than those who did not.

Question 2a.

He grew up in Oradea so he learnt how to speak Hungarian and Romanian at home, and learnt English and French at school.

Question 2b.

The saying is that the most important thing is the real thing – what you've got in your hand is real. Kraus never believed in things that were not concrete, and that is how he was successful in his business.

Question 2c.

Migrants have:

- more ambition and want to succeed
- a multicultural vision
- the desire to work hard and be successful in the new country.

Question 3c.

Text 5

Question 5a.

Question 5b.

- Explanation: Beautiful city on the Black Sea, a gate to the whole world
- Festivals: Mamaia and Mangalia are famous for their festivals

Question 5c.

- there are different cuisines and costumes.

Text 6

Question 6a.

The pies (two of):

- are baked at home
- look good
- taste good
- smell very tempting
- are made from natural ingredients.

Question 6b.

Listeners could receive the free recipe and the ticket to collect a free box of pies from the bakery.



Section 2 – Reading and responding

Part A – Answer in English

Students were required to read the text and then answer in English. Many students did not convey all the information required in order to receive the maximum marks.

Text 7

Text 7 was about the childhood of composer George Enescu.

Question 7a.

Any three of (with an explanation):

- the fiddler of the village: he played beautiful music on his violin and Jurjac loved it
- his parents: they bought him his first toy violin and took him to lessons
- his father: told him that if he doesn't want to study music, he will have to breed swine
- Nae Chiorul: taught him how to play the violin
- Eduard Caudella: encouraged him to play the violin and to go to Vienna to further his career.

Question 7b.

Caudella was surprised that the child was so bold as to ask him what he could play. He was also surprised about how talented the child was.

Question 7c.

Jurjac excelled at music, being a violinist, composer and pianist. He was a wonder child because he taught himself how to play the famous waltz with only two fingers, could play piano instantly, and he started to compose music at a very young age. At the age of seven, he was recommended to study music in Vienna.

Question 7d.

Mr Enescu said that there was one less swine breeder and one more musician in the world because such a gifted child would not be expected to become a swine breeder.
